March 23, 1835.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Night of the 17th of March instant, an armed Party fired a Shot through the Bed-room Window of Mr. John Steele, who resides on the Lands of Ballymacomb, in the County of Londonderry, the Ball of which lodged in the head of his Bed :

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIFTY POUNDS

to any Person or Persons, (except the Person or Persons who actually fired the Shot,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned therein.
