WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that as James Fagan, Esquire, of Mountrath, was passing through the said Town, on the night of Thursday, the 18th of June ultimo, he was violently and outrageously assaulted by several Persons at pre-

sent unknown, who assailed him with stones; also, that John Coghlan, a man in the campleyment of the said James Fagan, of Mountrath, Esq., was, upon the night of Tuesday, the 23d of June ult., beaten in a barbarous and cruck manner by some person or persons at present unknown.

If is Grace, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the perpetrators of the above Outrage, is pleased hereby to promise His Majesty's Pardon to any of the Persons concerned in the above-mentioned Outrage (except the Person or Persons who absolutely beat the said John Coghlan), who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such information as shall lead to the conviction of any, or all of the offenders.
