Ireland.

CARLISLE.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in a
V Session of Parliament, holden in the
17th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen
Victoria, entitled, "An Act to make further pro-
vision for defining the boundaries of counties,
baronies, half baronies, parishes, townlands, and
other divisions and denominations of land in
Ireland for public purposes," it is amongst other
things provided and enacted, that it shall be law-
ful for the Lord Lieutenant, if he shall see fitting
and expedient, to nominate any one or more per-
son or persons to ascertain and mark out any
alterations in the reputed boundaries of all and
every, or any county, barony, half barony, parish,
townland, or other division or denomination of
land, by what name soever any such division or
denomination shall or may be known or called in
any and every part of Ireland; and that the person
so appointed shall be called "The Boundary Sur-
veyor." And it is by said Act further enacted,
that when the Boundary Surveyor shall find that
any change or alteration has taken place in the
course of any river, stream, or fence, which had
before formed the boundary of any county, barony,
parish, townland, or other division or denomination
of land, or in any part of such boundary, as
marked out under the Act of the Sixth year of
the reign of his late Majesty King George 4, c. 99,
or that any land has been reclaimed from the sea,
or a tidal river, or a lake, that it shall be lawful
for such Boundary Surveyor to ascertain, define,
and mark out the present acknowledged or reputed
boundaries of every such county, barony, half
barony, parish, townland, or other division or
denomination of land, or of such portion or por-
tions thereof respectively, as such Boundary Sur-
veyor may deem it necessary to ascertain, define,
or mark out. And it is by said Act further
provided, that if any person or persons interested
in any such boundaries shall be dissatisfied with,
or shall have any objection to any boundary line,
or to any part thereof, as marked out by any Sur-
veyor, under the provisions of said Act, it shall
be lawful for such person or persons to appeal to
the Justices of the Peace, at the next General or
Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden for

the division of the county in which such boundaries line, or any part thereof so objected to, shall be situated. And it is by said Act further provided, that in all cases in which it is proposed to make any alteration of the boundary of any county or barony, the Boundary Surveyor shall submit to the Grand Jury of such county for approval, a Report, setting forth the detail of the proposed alterations in such boundaries, with the grounds for making the same, accompanied by a Map, showing the boundary or boundaries as originally laid down on the Ordnance Plans of such county or barony; and that in all cases of alteration in the boundary between counties, a Report and Explanatory Map shall be submitted for approval to the Grand Juries of both counties, and shall, after such approval, be fixed by the Judge of Assize in each county, at the same Spring or Summer Assizes, as the case may be, before any further proceedings take place in regard to the alteration of such county boundary. And it is by said Act further provided and enacted, that in all cases in which it is proposed to make an alteration in any boundary from that heretofore laid down on the Ordnance Plan of any county, whether such alteration refers to the boundaries of counties, baronies, parishes, townlands, or other denominations, the Boundary Surveyor shall, with all convenient speed, after such alteration shall have been so fixed, prepare and make out a Report in detail of the proposed alteration in any of such boundaries, with the grounds for making such alteration, accompanied by a plan or plans, showing in detail the original boundaries as laid down on the Ordnance Plans, and those which it is proposed to substitute for them, and shall submit the same to the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council, who may, if he or they shall think fit so to do, make an Order directing that the new boundary so marked out by the Boundary Surveyor, or altered by the Justices on hearing any appeal, or such portion or portions of either of such boundary lines, as such Lord Lieutenant should think proper, shall, for all public purposes, be, and be deemed and taken to be the boundary of, or portions of the boundary, as the case may be, of such county, barony, parish, townland, or other division or denomination of land. And it is by said Act further enacted and provided, that the Lord Lieutenant

and Council shall, by every such Order as aforesaid, fix and declare from what period the same shall take effect, and settle and adjust all such matters in respect to the right of voting at elections of members to serve in Parliament by persons holding or occupying houses, lands, or tenements in such county or barony, and for the alteration or amendment of the lists or registers of electors accordingly; and in respect of the assessment, applotment, and levy of Grand Jury, and all other rates and assessments, and in respect of all matters and things proper or necessary to be settled and adjusted, and that such Order shall be in all respects conclusive and binding in law, in respect of the several matters and things therein contained; and that such Order should be published in the *Dublin Gazette*, and a copy thereof, certified under the hand of the Clerk of the Privy Council, shall be transmitted to the Clerk of the Peace for each county to which such Order shall in any way relate, to be kept and preserved in his Office for the purposes in said Act stated. And whereas, in pursuance of the provisions contained in said recited Act, Richard Griffith, Esq., being the "Boundary Surveyor" in that behalf duly appointed, having found that changes and alterations had taken place in the course of certain rivers, streams, and fences, which had before formed part of the boundary of the county of Londonderry, and baronies, parishes, townlands, and other divisions or denominations of land in said county, as marked out under the said recited Act of the Sixth year of His late Majesty King George the 4th, cap. 99; and that land had been reclaimed from the sea, and tidal rivers and lakes, hath, in pursuance of the provisions of the said first-mentioned Act, defined, and marked out the present acknowledged and

reputed boundaries of such portions of the said county, baronies, half baronies, parishes, townlands, or other division or denomination of land, as he, the said Boundary Surveyor, deemed it necessary to ascertain, define, or mark out.

And whereas no appeals having been taken to the boundaries so defined and marked out as aforesaid, the said Richard Griffith, as such "Boundary Surveyor," duly submitted to the Grand Jury of the said county of Londonderry for approval, a Report, setting forth the detail of the proposed alterations in such boundaries, with the grounds for making the same, accompanied by a Map, showing the boundary or boundaries as originally laid down on the Ordnance Plans of such county or baronies, and which said Report was approved of by the Grand Jury of said county, and was, at the Summer Assizes of the year 1855, holden in and for the said county of Londonderry, filed by the presiding Judge of Assize, with the other presentments for said county. And whereas the said Richard Griffith, as such Boundary Surveyor as aforesaid, with all convenient speed, after such alterations had been so filed by the Judge of Assize for the said county of Londonderry as aforesaid, prepared and made out a Report, in detail, of the proposed alterations in the said boundaries, with the grounds for making such alterations, accompanied by plans, showing, in detail, the original boundaries as laid down on the Ordnance Plans, and which, for easy reference, he had coloured red on said Ordnance Plans, and lettered and numbered thereon. And those which it was proposed to substitute for them, and which for reference he had coloured blue on said Ordnance Plans, and hath submitted the same to the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council, and which Report is as follows, and the said Plans are annexed hereto:—

Now We, George William Frederick, Earl of Carlisle, Lord Lieutenant-General and General Governor of Ireland, and Privy Council of Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in us for that purpose under and by virtue of said first-mentioned Act, do hereby make, order, and direct, that the new boundaries so marked out by the said Richard Griffith, as such Boundary Surveyor as aforesaid, in such detailed Report so submitted to us as aforesaid, and which are also marked out and coloured in the said plans also submitted to us, showing in detail the original boundaries as laid down on the Ordnance Plans, and those which it was proposed to substitute for them, shall for all public purposes be, and be deemed and taken to be the boundary of such county of Londonderry, and of the baronies, parishes, townlands, or other divisions or denominations of land as therein specified. And we do further order, fix, and declare, that this our Order shall take effect from the 1st day of May, in this present year of our Lord, 1856.

And we do hereby further order and direct that the Order herein made shall not take effect so far as relates to the elective franchise of any individual, or his right to vote at elections of members to serve in Parliament at present enjoyed under any subsisting registry of such right until the expiration of such subsisting registry; and that so far as relates to the apportionment, applotment, or col-

lection of Grand Jury cess, and the presentment of public money, and any Grand Jury presentment, and any matter and thing relating thereto, and the appointment of high constables, and the collectors of public money, that this Order shall be in force and take effect from and after the next Assizes in and for the said county of Londonderry; but that as to all new registrations of the right of voting at elections for members to serve in Parliament for the said county of Londonderry, and as to all causes and matters, civil and criminal, except those now pending in any of the Superior Courts, or Courts of Quarter Sessions, or Civil Bill Court, and as to the jurisdiction, civil as well as criminal, of any Justice of the Peace, Assistant Barrister, or other person, in and for the said county, and as to all other intents and purposes whatsoever not herein specially provided for, this Order shall commence and take effect from the said 1st day of May, in the year of our Lord, 1856. And we do further order and direct that this our Order shall be published in the *Dublin Gazette*. And we do further order and direct that a copy of this our Order, certified under the hand of the Clerk of the Privy Council, with the plans referred to therein, shall be transmitted to the Clerk of the Peace of the said county of Londonderry, to be by him kept and preserved in his Office, as provided by said recited Act.

Given at the Council Chamber in Dublin, this 22nd day of April, 1856 (Fifty-six).
