In 2019, the Commission published the Report on its Fifth Programme of Law Reform (LRC 120-2019). The Fifth Programme was prepared by the Commission following broad public consultation and discussion, during which the Commission received 77 written submissions and held discussions with NGOs, representative groups, Government Departments and the Oireachtas Joint Committee on Justice, Equality and Defence. Following this consultation process, in accordance with the 1975 Act the Fifth Programme of Law Reform was approved by the Government on 20th March 2019. The Fifth Programme contains 15 projects:

- 1. Reform of Non-Court Adjudicative Bodies and Appeals to Courts;
- 2. A Regulatory Framework for Adult Safegaurding;
- 3. Privacy and Technology in the Digital Era;
- 4. Structured Sentencing;
- 5. Review and Consolidation of the Law of Sexual Offences;
- 6. Perjury;
- 7. Compensating Victims of Crime;
- 8. Regulation of Detention in Garda Custody;
- 9. Caps on Damages in Personal Injuries Litigation;
- 10. Protective Cost Orders;
- 11. Liability of Hotels and Related Establishments;
- 12. Liability of Unincorporated Associations;
- 13. Aspects of the Law of Evidence;
- 14. Aspects of Family Law;
- 15. Aspects of Land and Conveyancing Law.
