WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the 25th ultimo, Three armed Men entered a Field, near the Village of Ballsmill, (a Fourth, also armed, remaining on the Road,) Parish of Creggan, Barony of Upper Fews, and County of Armagh, in which Michael M'Gee was Ploughing, each of whom presented a Pistol at him, fired a Shot, compelled him to quit his Work, and threatened to take his life if seen on the Lands again :

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIFTY POUNDS

to any Person or Persons who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all or any of them.

Description of the Persons.

One Man, about 5 feet 5 inches high, dark complexion, black hair, about 35 or 40 years of age; wore a grey frieze coat, grey cloth trousers, and blue cloth cap.

Another, about 20 years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, black hair; wore a grey frieze coat, corduroy trousers, and a blue cloth cap.

Another, about 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, 27 years of age, or thereabouts, black hair, sallow complexion; wore a grey frieze coat, grey cloth trousers, and a blue cloth cap.

A fourth Person, who stood some distance off, with a gun in his hand, wore white trousers, and a blue cloth coat and hat.
