WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Night of the 6th instant, a Stable, the Property of Mr. Cummins, Innkeeper, at Bagenalstown, in the County of Carlow, was maliciously set on fire and consumed, whereby several Horses were so burned, that they are not expected to recover :
