[[] HEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on Tuesday, the th of May instant, as four Bailiffs were conreying a Prisoner to the County Gaol, they were attacked in the Neighbourhood of Tullyvin, not far from Cootehill, in the County of Cavan, by several Persons, with the intention of rescuing the Prisoner; by which attack one of the Bailiffs was severely wounded, and another mortally, in consequence of which he died the same Evening.

His Grace, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons (except the Person or Persons, who actually struck the blow which caused the Bailif's death,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned in this daring Outrage and Murder.
