26th January, 1831.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the night of Monday, the 29th of November last, as a Man of the name of John Steenson, of Rakeevin, was returning from the Market of Bailieborough, in the County of Cavan, he was waylaid within a quarter of a mile of the said Town of Bailieborough, and barbarously murdered.

His Excellency for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS

to any Person or Persons (except the Person or Persons who actually gave the blow which caused Steenson's death,) who shall within Six Months from the date hereof, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons who committed the said Murder.
