DUBLIN CASTLE. 29th August, 1829. TTHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that several violent and daring Attacks have at diffirent times lately been made on the Property of the Rev. William Davoren, of Kiltaraght, in the Barony of Corcomroe in the County of Clare, his Hay thrown down and scuttered abroad in the Field, and several Tons of Straw maliciously burnts also that Twenty-eight Houd of Cattle wore driven into the Church-yard, a breach having been made in the Wall for that purpose; and that his Labourers were warned to quit his service, and threatened with death in case of refusal; also, that on the Night of Monday, the 17th of August, instant, one of his Men was most violently assaulted and beaten; and that on the 19th of August instant, Michael Pilkington, the Parish Clerk of the Church, who was employed in bringing home Turf for the said William Davoren, was waylaid about the Hour of Eleven o'Clock in the Morning, and so severely beaten that his life is in danger, and that the Rev. William Davoren, in conse-

quence of the above-mentioned Outrages, and system of Intimidation, is in danger of his Life, with the Lives of all his Family and Servants :
