WHEREAS, it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Night of Friday, the 18th of December, instant, a Party, consisting of Eleven Men, attacked the House of a Man named Doyle, who resides at Drumnelly, about eight miles from the Town of Kilrush, in the County of Clare, and having obtained entrance, dragged two Brothers of the name of Doyle, out of their beds, and beat them most uninercifully, and that they then forcibly pressed their throats, until their tongues protruded from their mouths, which they laid hold of, and cut off.

His Grace, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this horrible Attack and Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS,

or Persons who actually beat them and cut out ther tongues,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned in this barbarous Outrage.
