HEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Evening of Friday, the 21st of January ultimo, between the Hours of Eight and Nine o'Clock in the Evening, an armed Party attacked the House of William Blood, Esq. of Applevale, near Corrofin, in the County of Clare, and cruelly murdered him.

His Excellency for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this daring Outrage and Murder, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS

to any Person or Persons who shall within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned therein.

And further, His Excellency is pleased hereby to declare, that if any of the Persons concerned in the above-mentioned Murder (except the Person or Persons who actually committed the said Murder,) shall within Six Months from the date hereof, declare their Accomplices, so that they may be apprehended and brought to Justice, he or they shall receive His Majesty's Most Gracious Pardon, as well as the said Reward.
