WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on Monday, the 4th of April instant, about the Hour of Two o'Clock, a Party of Police, consisting of Five Men, who were stationed at Doolen, while engaged in the execution of their duty, in the Neighbourhood of Ennistymon, in the County of Clare, were attacked by a large assemblage of armed Men, and the entire Party most barbarously murdered.

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this daring Outrage and Murder, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons (except the Persons who actually committed the Murders,) who shall within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned in this Outrage.
