And in order to induce any of the Accomplices in the said Murder to make discovery thereof, We do hereby offer His Majesty's most gracious Pardon to any of the said Accomplices (except the Person or Persons who actually fined at the said Richard Crofts, and those actually present, aiding, abetting and assisting, in the said Murder) who shall give information, so as that the others or any of them may be apprehended and prosecuted to Conviction, and so as said last-mentioned discovery shall be made within the Space of Two Calendar Months from the date hereof.
