

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that information having been received by G. B. Low, Esq. and Chief Constable Crossley, of the Doneraile District, that two notorious Outlaws, of the names of Magner and Daly, were concealed in the Village of Shanballymore; the above-mentioned Gentlemen, accompanied by a Police force, proceeded to the said Village of Shanballymore, in the District of Doneraile, in the County of Cork, where they discovered the said Outlaws concealed in a house, who immediately rushed out of the Village, armed, and were pursued by G. B. Low, Esq., a Gentleman of the name of Woodley, and a mounted Policeman; also, that several shots were fired at them by the said Outlaws, by which the Policeman was severely wounded; and that the above-mentioned Outlaws being repeatedly summoned by Mr. Low to surrender, and having refused, their fire was returned, by which one of the Outlaws, of the name of Magner, was shot dead, and the other, of the name of Daly, wounded, but that Daly succeeded in effecting his escape.

His Grace, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the above-mentioned Outlaw, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the above-mentioned Outlaw, Daly.
