## DUBLIN CASTLE,

31st October, 1832. WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that Mr. Warren, Clerk of the Session at Doneraile, who was proceeding to Cork, was attacked at a place called Killavullen, where the Coach in which he was a passenger, stopped to change horses, dragged off the Coach, and severely beaten, so as to prevent him proceeding on his journey :

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS

to any Person or Persons (except the Person or Persons who struck Mr. Warren) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the Apprehension and Conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned in this Outrage.
