WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Night of Friday, the 26th of October ultimo, Daniel M'Alean, or M'Aloon, of Gortnasilla, was Murdered near Glenties, in the County of Donegal.

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIFTY POUNDS

to any Person or Persons (except the Person or Persons who actually committed the Murder,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned in this Outrage.

And further, His Excellency is pleased hereby to promise His Majesty's Most Gracious Pardon to any of the Persons concerned therein, (except the Principals) who shall, within Six Months, declare his Accomplices, so that all, or any of them, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
