R E W A R D.

WHEREAS, between the hours of Nine and Ten o'Clock, on the Night of Saturday, the 24th December, 1831, a most daring, wanton, and cruel attack was made on the Dwelling-House of John Baxter, of the Townland of Kilmore, in the County of Down, by a number of armed Men, supposed to amount to between fifty and sixty, who fired several Gun Shots into the House :

Now, We whose Names are hereunto subscribed, being determined, so far as in us lies, to protect the lives and properties of His Majesty's subjects ; and holding in abhorrence the perpetrators of such diabolical acts, do hereby offer a Reward of

THREE HUNDRED POUNDS,

in proportion to the sums annexed to our respective names, to such person or persons as shall, within six calendar months from the date hereof, prosecute to conviction all or any of the Persons, not now in custody, who were concerned in the aforesaid Outrage. And we do further offer a Reward of

FIFTY POUNDS,

for such private information as may lead to the conviction of any of the offenders.
