WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Night of Thursday, the 18th instant, some Person or Persons entered the House of Mr. John Grant, who resided at the Town of Newry, in the County of Down, and cruelly murdered him.

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this daring Outrage and Murder, is pleased hereby to offer His Majesty's Most Gracious Pardon to any of the Persons concerned therein, (except the Persons who actually committed the Murder,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, come forward and declare his accomplices, so that all, or any of them may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
