

WHEREAS about the Hour of Nine o'Clock in the Morning of the 6th July last, a Number of Men armed with Bludgeons, attacked the Apprentices and other Workmen of Robert Morton, Ship Builder, in Great Brunswick-street, nearly opposite the Hibernian Gas Station, and from the Wounds that one of said Apprentices, Andrew Merchant, received, he almost immediately died, and an other Workman in the employment of said Rob. Morton, also from the Wounds he then received now lies dangerously ill. We, the undersigned, viewing with abhorrence the above outrage, do hereby offer the Sums annexed to our respective Names, to such Person or Persons as shall give such Information as may lead to the Apprehension of any Person or Persons who committed, aided, or assisted in causing said Felony and Murder, on their Conviction, within Six Calendar Months from the Date hereof.—Dublin, 6th July 1825.
