

DUBLIN CASTLE,

June 18, 1835.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on Tuesday, the 9th, or early on the Morning of Wednesday, the 10th instant, some Persons unknown, went on the Lands of Slapperagh, in the Parish of Cleenish, County of Fermanagh, and drove from thence the Cattle of John Keary, cut off the Tails of Sixteen of them, and drove Two into a Lake on said Lands, where they were drowned :

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIFTY POUNDS

to any Person or Persons (except the Person or Persons who actually committed the same,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned therein.
