HEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Night of Tuesday, the 22d of April instant, some Persons entered the Lands of Kinrisk, near Kilconnell, in the County of Galway, and drove forty-four Sheep into a Drain, in consequence of which sixteen were drowned, and the remainder dragged out in a lifeless state.

His Grace, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIFTY POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons (except the Persons who actually committed the Outrage,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned in this Outrage.
