whiskers, fair hair, high complexion; wore a grey frieze body coat, corduroy breeches, and Carolina hat; generally wears his stockings drawn over the knees of his breeches.

John Sullivan—About 21 years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, dark complexion, no beard or whiskers, dark hair, grey eyes, stout made, square shoulders; wore a grey frieze coat, corduroy trowsers, and straw hat.
