WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that a Person of the name of Michael Drohan (who acted as Tithe Proctor and Process Server to the Rev. Mr. Butler of Burnchurch,) was cruelly murdered near Wollengrange, in the County of Kilkenny, on Monday, the 21st of March, inst.

His Excellency for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Murder, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons (except the Person or Persons who actually committed the said Murder,) who shall within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned in this daring Outrage and Murder.

And that such Measures shall be adopted, as will effectually protect such Person or Persons against any Outrage or Violence which may be attempted against him or them, or apprehended in consequence of his or their giving such Information as aforesaid.
