WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that a violent Attack was made on the Police, on Wednesday, the 14th of December ultimo, at Carricksheck, in the County of Kilkenny, when Chief Constable Gibbons, and several other members of the Police force were murdered; and Whereas William Cane was the leader and principal in this Attack, who has hitherto escaped apprehension:

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the said William Cane, the principal in said Attack, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS

to any Person or Persons, (except the Persons who were actually engaged with him in this Attack) who shall give such information as shall lead to the apprehension of the said William Cane, or who shall deliver the said William Cane into the hands of any Police party.
