WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that a most violent Attack was made by several Persons armed with Stones, Pitchforks, &c. on the Evening of Saturday the 14th of November instant, on the Lands of Forecussagh, near the Town of Mohill, in the County of Leitrim, on Four Constables, who had proceeded to the said Lands of Forecussagh, to arrest a Man of the Name of James M'Glynn, charged with Rape, and that the Crowd rescued the said M'Glynn, after being arrested by the Constables, and pursued the said Constables into the Town of Drumlish, in the County of Longford.

His Grace, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of any or all of the Perpetrators of this Attack and Rescue.
