WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Night of the 1st inst an armed Farty went to the House of Terence O'Brien, of Lemonfield, in the Liberties of the City of Limerick, fired several Shots, and warned him, on pain of Death, to give up a Farm he had taken at Doneen, in the l'arish of l'ubblebrien, and County of Limerick; and that on the Morning of the 4th instant, an armed Party (supposed to be the same,) went to the said Farm when O'Brien and his Son were at work, fired several Shots at them, pursuing them to the House of Mr. Jeremiah Carmody; and afterwards set fire to a House on said Farm, and shot a Horse belonging to O'Brien; and that on the 4th instant, between Eleven and Twelve o'Clock at Noon, an armed Party (also believed to be the same,) went to the Lands of Fanningstown, in the said County, and shot Two Horses, the Property of Mr. John Williamstown:

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of these Outrages, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS

to any Person or Persons who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all or any of them.
