WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on Tuesday the 24th day July instant, a most violent attack was made by a large assemblage of Persons, on five Men who were employed in viewing the Crops in the Parish of Collon, in the County Louth, with a view of their being averaged for Tithes, and that the mob so severely beat these men, that the lives of some them are despaired of:

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this daring Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS

to any Person or Persons (except the Leaders of this attack) who shall within Six Months from the date hereof, give such information as shall lead to the Apprehension and Conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned therein.
