WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Evening of Sunday, the 17th of January instant, between the Hours of Nine and Ten o'Clock, as a Person of the name of Robert M'Kay, (Steward to Lord Langford,) was returning home from the House of a Man named Walter Bourke, in the Village of Summerhill, in the County of Meath, he was knocked down from behind by a Man, who, whilst he was on the ground, shot him, and then ran off.
