18th October, 1829.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that early on the Morning of Sunday the 11th of October Instant, a most daring attack was made on the Dwelling-house of the Rev. Mathew James Shaw, Incumbent of the Parish of Kilmactranny, on the Borders of Sligo and Roscommon, and near the Post Town of Keadue, in the County of Roscommon, the Window of the Bed-Room in which he was sleeping being violently dashed in, and that a Man with his face blackened and armed with some offensive Weapon, with an Iron point, violently rushed into the Room, and forcing Mr. Shaw to leave his bed, compelled him to take many illegal Oaths.

His Grace for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this violent and daring Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons (except the Person who entered Mr. Shaw's Bed-Room), who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of any, or all of the Persons concerned in this Outrage.
