20th November, 1829.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Evening of Wednesday, the 11th of November, instant, about the Hour of Four o'Clock, a most violent and daring Attack was made on the Reverend Edward Day, Curate of the Parish and Town of Roscommon, (who was returning on Horseback to the said Town of Roscommon, from a visit to a Sick Parishioner,) near a Bridge which is distant from the Town about Two Hundred Yards, by a Man, who rushed forward and ordered Mr. Day to stop, and that on his urging his Horse to proceed, the said Person immediately discharged a Pistol at him, which severely wounded Mr. Day in the Shoulder.

His Grace, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this daring Attack and Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons (except the Person who actually fired the Shot,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all or any of the Persons concerned in the above-mentioned most atrocious Outrage.
