

DUBLIN CASTLE,

January 30, 1834.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Evening of Monday, the 9th of December ult., as Laurence M'Donnell and Michael M'Dermot were returning from the Fair of Ballintogher, they were stopped on the Mail Coach Road, between Sligo and Ballina, and severely beaten by four Men, of which beating M'Donnell has since died:

His Excellency is pleased hereby to promise His Majesty's Most Gracious Pardon to any of the Perpetrators of this Murder (except the Person or Persons who actually struck the deceased,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, declare his accomplices, so that all or any of them may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
