June 19, 1834.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Night of the 6th of June instant, the Dwelling-House of a poor Man named Shieron, of Trienmore, near Ballesodare, in the County of Sligo, was maliciously set on fire and consumed :

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

FIFTY POUNDS

to any Person or Persons (except the Person or Persons who actually set fire to the Premises,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned in this Outrage.
