

Dublin Castle, February 17, 1824.

THE Lord Lieutenant, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the dreadful Outrage committed at the House of Michael Hamerton, Esq. of Hamerton, near Clonmel, in the County of Tipperary, on the 9th Instant, when Mr. Hamerton was barbarously assailed and so dangerously wounded, as to make the hopes of his recovery very doubtful, and his Servant also received a Gun-shot Wound, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of **ONE HUNDRED POUNDS**, in addition to the Subscriptions entered into by the Magistrates and Gentlemen; also a Promise of His Majesty's Free Pardon to any of the Persons concerned therein, except the Person or Persons who committed the Outrage on Mr. Hamerton, and the Person or Persons who actually fired the Shots by which Mr. Hamerton's Servant was wounded, who shall within Six Calendar Months from the Date hereof, discover their Accomplices, so as that they, or any of them, be convicted of the said Outrage.
