WHERRAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Evening of Sunday the 15th of November instant, the House of Mr. Green, of Cappoghmurrow, about Six Miles from the Town of Cashel, and near the Village of Dundrum, in the County of Tipperary, was attacked by an armed Party, seven in number, who stationed Sentries on the Door of the Dining-Room, and proceeded to Rob the House of several stand of Arms, several Pounds in Notes and Silver, and some Plate,

His Grace, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as may lead to the apprehension and conviction of any or all of the Persons concerned in this Attack,
