WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lords Justices, that about the hour of Twelve o'Clock on the night of the 22nd instant, Mr. John Ellis was murdered by some person or persons at present unknown, near his residence at Kilkilahera, in the Barony of Eliogarty, in the North Riding of the County of Tipperary.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS.

to any person or persons, who shall, within six months from the date hereof, give such information as shall lead to the **ARREST** of the person or persons who committed the same.
