WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that as a Person named Hugh M'Kenna, of Tulnafaul, in the Barony of Clogher, near the Post-Town of Clogher, and in the County of Tyrone, was returning from the Market of Aughnacloy, in the same County, on the Night of Wednesday, the 9th of December instant, he was waylaid, and beaten so severely, that he died soon after of the wounds received.

His Grace, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS,

Persons who actually struck the blow or blows, which caused M'Kenna's death,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned in this Murder.
