DUBLIN CASTLE, 14th September, 1831.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the Night of Sunday, the 21st of August ultimo, a Party of Men assembled on the pound of Captain Bell, of Bellmount, near Stewartstown, and about nine miles from the Town of Dungannon, in the County of Tyrone, and carried off some Corn which had been seized for Rent; and that

on Captain Bell's endeavouring to seize the Principal in this affair, (a Man of the name of M'Nemanee,) he was fired at by two Persons,

and severely wounded in the head:

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS

to any Person or Persons (except the aforesaid James M'Nemanee, and the Persons who fired the Shots) who shall, within Six Months from

the date hereof, give such information as shall

lead to the apprehension and conviction of all,

or any of the Persons concerned in this daring

Attack.
