**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the 5th of February instant, as Roger O'Neill was returning from a Funeral, between Killeek and Gardoune, in the County Tyrone, he was struck on the head with a spade, by some Persons who have absconded; of which blow he has since died:

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Murder, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

**FIFTY POUNDS**

to any Person or Persons (except the Person or Persons who actually struck the blow,) who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned therein.
