WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lords Justices, that between the hours of Six and Seven o'Clock on the evening of the 28th ultimo, a shot was fired by some person at present unknown, into the house of Robert M'Collum, near Six-mile-cross, in the barony of East Omagh, in the county of Tyrone, by which the said Robert M'Collum was killed:

Their Excellencies, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Murder, are pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS

to any person or persons, who shall, within six months from the date hereof, give such information as shall lead to the **ARREST** of the person or persons who committed the same.
