And on entering John Brady's house, shey threatened to take his Life if he did not give up the Lands, on his promising to do so they spared it, and went away, saying if it was **necessary** they would visit him again; that they then went to the house of his relative Christopher Smith residing close to him, commanding him to persuade John Brady to obey their orders, as also the house of Thomas Brady, another relation, where they pushed in his Window, when the said Brady ran out, accompanied by James Haggarty who recognised some of the Party, on which Haggarty was shot dead.

A Subscription of \pounds 700 has been entered into, for such Public or Private Information that may lead to the Prosecution to Conviction, the Person or Persons as may be found guilty of the aforesaid Murder and Outrage.

advertisement, is pleased hereby to promise Hin Majesty's most gracious Pardon to any one of them (excepting the person who fired the shot whereby the said James Haggarty was killed), who shall, within six months from the date hereof, discover his accomplices, so that they, or any of them, be convicted.
