DUBLIN CASTLE, 21st December, 1826.

WHERE AS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that the House of George Longworth, of Craggan, Esq. was, about Six o'Clock on the Evening of the 13th instant, entered by a Party of Men armed with Pikes and Pistols, three of whom entered the Drawing-room, where Mrs. Longworth and her Children were sitting, and swore, if they made any alarm, they would shoot her, and one of them presented a Pistol at Mrs. Longworth; and that Mr. Francis Longworth his Nephew, having shortly afterwards rushed into the Drawingroom, he was immediately seized by the three men, who stabbed him in four places, and it is feared the wounds will prove fatal; that the Party then fled leaving one of their Associates dead, whom it is supposed they stabbed in mistake for Mr. George Longworth, who had gone up to his Red-room in search of Arms.

His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Parties concerned in the Outrage above mentioned, is pleased hereby to declare, that if any Person or Persons shall, within Six Months from the date hereof give Information which may lead to the discovery of all or any of the Persons concerned in the Outrage above mentioned, so as that they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, such Person or Persons shall receive a Reward of

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS,

And further, that if any one of the Persons concerned in the said Outrage, (except the Persons who wounded Mr. Francis Longworth) shall, within the time aforesaid, discover his Ac-

complices, so as that they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, they shall receive His Majesty's Pardon, as well as the said Reward.
