HEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on Thursday Evening, the 22d of November last, John Flood was Murdered near Baltiboys, in the Parish of Blessinton, in the County of Wicklow, by some Persons unknown:

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this Outrage, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS,

to any Person or Persons who shall, within Twelve Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons who committed this Murder:

And further, His Excellency is pleased hereby to promise His Majesty's Most Gracious Pardon to any of the Persons concerned in this Murder, (except the Person or Persons who actually fired the Shot which caused Flood's death,) who shall, within the above time, come forward and declare his Accomplices, so that they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
