WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on Sunday Evening, the 12th of January instant, two Men armed entered the House of George Butler, on the Lands of Ballintubber, near the Town of Blessington, in the County of Wicklow, and on meeting opposition from Butler, one of them fired a Shot which wounded him so severely that he has since died :

His Excellency, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the Perpetrators of this Murder, is pleased hereby to offer a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS

to any Person or Persons who shall, within Six Months from the date hereof, give such Information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of all, or any of the Persons concerned therein.
