A PROCLAMATION.

RD. DUBLIN, THOS. LEFROY, E. BLAKENEY.

THEREAS by a certain Proclamation of the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council of Ireland, made in pursuance of the Provisions of the Acts of Parliament in force for that purpose, the County of Tipperary was heretofore divided into three Divisions for the purpose of more conveniently hearing and determining Causes by Civil Bill, and of transacting all such Criminal or other business as might be cognizable or determinable at any General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace, that is to say, one of the said Divisions to be called the District or Division of Cashel, and was appointed to consist of the Baronies of Clanwilliam, Middlethird, and Slievarda, and Compsey, save and except the Parishes of Kilcooly, Buolic, and Fennor, in the said Barony of Slicrarda, and the Towns of Cashel and No. 14,595.

Tipperary were the Towns appointed for holding Sessions in and for said District; and that three General Sessions of the Peacefor the purposes aforesaid, should be held in the Town of Cashel in each and every year, and one General Sessions of the Peace for the purposes aforesaid, in the Town of Tipperary, in each and every year in and for the said District of Cashel. And Whereas by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament holden in the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to Consolidate and Amend the laws

relating to Civil Bills, and the Courts of Quarter Sessions in Ireland, and to transfer to the Assistant-Barristers certain Jurisdiction as to Insolvent Debtors," it is amongst other things provided and enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ircland for the time being, from time to time, by and with the advice and consent of the Privy Council, to alter the Divisions and Districts for the holding of Sessions in any County or Riding now existing, or hereafter to exist, and to divide the several Counties or any of them, or any Riding or Division of a County, including all Counties of Cities, Boroughs, Towns, and Places into as many

Divisions or Districts as shall be thought proper or expedient, for the purpose of more conveniently hearing and determining Causes by Civil Bill, and of transacting all such Criminal or all such other business, as may be cognizable or determinable at any General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace, and to appoint one or more convenient Town or Place, Towns or Places, in any such Division or District in which a Civil Bill Court and a Court for transacting such Criminal and other business as aforesaid, or a Civil Bill Court only for hearing and

determining causes by Civil Bill, and from time to time to alter any such Division or District, or any Town and place, Towns and places within such Division or District, or to discontinue any such

Town or place as to the said Lord Lieutenant, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit, and the every such Division or District should be disting guished by the name of such Town or place, and that every such Sessions and adjournment thereof

should be good and effectual for the adminis-

tration of Criminal and Civil business, and doing

all other business that might by Law be done

at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, or for hearing and determining Causes by Civil Bill

as the case might be, and that in case of any Town or place being discoptinued, the same should

thereupon cease to be a Town or place for the holding of Sessions therein for any purpose whatsoever. And it is by said Act further enacted and provided that it shall be lawful for the Lord Lieu-

tenant, with the advice aforesaid, to direct that a General Sessions of the Peace and Civil Bill Court only shall be held any number of times not exceeding four times in every year in all or any of the Towns or places now appointed or which may hereafter be appointed for holding Sessions, and nominate and appoint the Baronies or half Baronies, or Parishes for which respectively such Sessions shall be held. And Whereas a Memorial hath been presented unto Us from certain Inhabitants of the Cashel Division of the said County of Tipperary, praying that an alteration might be made in the number of times for holding Sessions in the said Towns of Tipperary and Cashel, as heretofore constituted. Now We, the Lord Justices of Ireland, in pursuance of the Powers vested in Us by said recited Act, and by and with the consent and advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council of Ireland, do hereby appoint that from and after the Michaelmas Sessions for the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, to be holden in and for the said County of Tipperary, that the District or Division of Cashel shall consist of the Baronies of Clanwilliam, Middlethird, and Slievarda and Compsey, save and except the Parishes of Kilcooley, Buolic, and Fennor, in the said Barony of Slievarda. And we do nominate and direct that the Towns of Tipperary and Cashel be the Towns for holding of Sessions for said District. And we direct that two Sessions of the Peace, for the purposes aforesaid, shall be held in each and every Year, in the said Town of Tipperary, and that two Sessions of the Peace for the purposes aforesaid shall be held in each and every year, in the said Town of Cashel, in and for the said District or Division of Cashel. And that the Assistant-Barrister for the said County of Tipperary, shall appoint the times for holding Quarter Sessions in and for said District or Division, of
