HIS Excellency the Lord Lieutenant hereby directs and requires, that all the Out-Pen. tioners of Chelsea Hospital, and all those Men Men who are registered in the Books of Chelsea Hos. pital, with a view to prospective Pension; and also all Out Pensioners and registered Men of Kilmainham Hospital, residing in Ireland, who were discharged from their respective Corps, as Non-commissioned Officers or Privates, whether from the Regular Cavalry, Foot Guards, or Infantry of the Line, or from the Militia or Fencibles, do perfonally appear at the Places here. after mentioned, on Thursday the 6th Day of December, or on any of the succeeding Days, until the 12th of the same Month inclusive, in order that such of them as on examination shall be found fit, may be attached to fuch Corps as shall be hereafter ap. pointed. His Excellency, however, directs, that the present Order shall not be considered as extending to the Out. Penfioners from the late Horse Guards, and Horse Grenadier Guards, the Life Guards, and Royal Regiment of Horse Guards, nor to fuch Men as by the Hospital Books are now more than forty-five years of age, or had ferved twenty-four years in the Cavalry, or twentyone years in the Infantry, previous to their difcharges; nor to any Nien discharged as Privates. whose Pensions are above ten pence per Diem each; nor to those who have lost a limb, or their eye-fight. or are cripples, or who received a Certificate of their unfitness for further Service, from any of the Officers employed at the last General Examination of Out-Pentioners of Chelfea and Kilmainham refpectively; nor to such Out-Pensioners as are now ferving in the Regular Militia, as non-commissioned Officers, or in the Police Establishments of the City of Dublin, or of the respective Counties in which that description of protection is main-

of Assembling, they shall, if found fit to serve, be attached to a Regiment with the fame Bounty, Pay, and Allowances as the Men who are included in the Call. Should any of the Regiments to which Out-

Pensioners may be attached in pursuance of this Proclamation, be ordered on Foreign Service, the Out-Pensioners so attached will be transferred to

other Corps ferving within the United Kingdom. And it is hereby notified, that all the Out-Peu-fioners hereby called upon to attend, who shall not appear at any of the Times and Fleces herein ap-

pointed, will be firuck off the Books of the Out. Pension of the said Hospitals respectively, according to the Regulations under which fuch Penfion is granted, without any prospect of being
