

## DROGHEDA DISTRICT.—CLOSE SEASON.

### FISHERIES.

**WE**, the Commissioners acting in execution of an Act made and passed in the Fifth and Sixth Years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to regulate the Irish Fisheries," and the several Acts since passed amending the same, having taken the necessary preliminary steps for the purpose, and in pursuance of the powers and authorities in us vested in that behalf, do hereby decide that in the District No. 17, heretofore defined and known as the Drogheda District, situated within the Counties of Down, Louth, Monaghan, Cavan, Meath, Westmeath, King's, Kildare, and Dublin, hereinafter mentioned, the respective periods authorized and directed by the said Acts, or any of them, as the Close Time for Fish of the Salmon kind, shall cease.

And we, the said Commissioners, do hereby further decide that the Close Time during which it shall not be lawful to kill, destroy, or take Fish of the Salmon kind, in or from any Estuary, or on the Sea Coast, or in or from the Tideway of any River or Lake, or the part thereof where the tide ebbs and flows, or in or from any part of any River or Lake above the Tideway, within that part of the said Drogheda District, situate between the Skerries, in the County of Dublin, and Cranfield Point, in the County of Down, with the several Rivers flowing into the Sea between those two points respectively, with Nets and all other Engines, (save Rods and Lines only,) shall be between the 20th day of August in each year, and the 11th day of February in the year following, both said days inclusive.

And we, the said Commissioners, do hereby further decide that the Close Time during which it shall not be lawful to kill, destroy, or take Fish of the Salmon kind in or from any Estuary, or on the Sea Coast, or in or from the Tideway of any River or Lake, or the part thereof where the tide ebbs and flows, or in or from any part of any River or Lake above the Tideway within that part of the said Drogheda District, situate between Cranfield Point, in the County of Down, and Donaghadee, in said County of Down, with the several Rivers flowing into the Sea between those two points respectively, with Nets and all other Engines (save Rods and Lines only,) shall be between the 29th day of September in each

year, and the last day of February in the year following, both said days inclusive.

And we, the said Commissioners, do hereby further decide, that the Close Time during which it shall not be lawful to kill, destroy, or take Fish of the Salmon kind, in or from any part of any River or Lake within any part of the said District of Drogheda, with Rods and Lines, shall be between the 29th day of September in each year, and the 11th day of February in the year following, both said days inclusive.
