RIVER INVER.

TE, the Commissioners acting in execution of an Act made and passed in the Session of Parliament, holden in the 5th and 6th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the Irish Fisheries and the several Acts amending the same," having taken the necessary preliminary steps for the purpose, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in Us vested in that behalf by said Acts, or some one of them, do hereby decide that the respective periods authorized and directed by the said Acts, or any of them, as the Close Time for Fish of the Salmon kind, so far as regards the killing, destroying, or taking of the

same, with single Rods and Lines only in the freshwater portions of the River Inver and its Tributaries, said River being situate in the District No. 13, heretofore defined and known as the Ballyshannon District, situated within the County of Donoral shall coose

Donegal, shall cease.

And We, the said Commissioners, do hereby further decide that the Close Time for Salmon or Fish of the Salmon kind, in the freshwater portions of the said River Inver and its Tributaries, situate in said District, as regards the killing, destroying, or taking of the same with Rods and Lines only, shall from henceforth be between the 28th day of September in each year, and the 1st day of March in the year following.
