Whitehall, 12th February 1822.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

A New Seal for that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland, having been this Day laid

before His Majesty, His Majesty was pleased to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Right Honorable Robert Peel, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do cause the said Seal to be put into the Hands of the Most Noble Richard Marquess Wellesley, K. G. Lord Lieutenant of that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland; who is to take care to deliver the same to the proper Officer there, and to cause the Old Seal to be defaced in the Council of that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

Whereupon, the Right Honorable Thomas Lord Manners, Lord Chancellor of Ireland, delivered the Old Seal into the Hands of His Excellency, who directed that it should be defaced, in obedience to His Majesty's Commands; and the Old Seal having been defaced accordingly, His Excellency delivered the New Seal into the Hands of the Right Honorable the Lord Chancellor.
