GENTLEMEN,

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 8th and 9th pass of the P 9th year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for " regulating the Pipe Water of the City of Dublin; "and to enable the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and "Burgesses of the City of Dublin to extend the " supply of Pipe Water to the several Parishes or " portion of Parishes situate in the City and County " of Dublin, and adjoining to the Borough of the "said City of Dublin, but outside the Boundary "thereof," it is amongst other things enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act, upon the application of Twenty-one or more Householders residing in any Parish, or portion of a Parish, situate in the County of Dublin, adjoining to but outside the Boundary of the Borough of the City of Dublin, each of such Householders occupying a Dwelling-house assessed or rated under the provisions of an Act passed in the 1st and 2nd years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for the more effectual Relief of " the Destitute Poor in Ireland," as of the Annual Value of Twenty Pounds or more, it shall be lawful for the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland for the time being, to

authorize the carrying this Act into execution within the said Parish, or portion of a Parish, and for that purpose to Order and Direct two or more Justices of the Peace for the County of Dublin, resident within the County of Dublin, to convene a Meeting for the purpose of carrying this Act into execution, and to preside thereat, such Orders and Directions to be signified by the Chief Secretary of the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors, or in his absence by the Under Secretary.

And whereas an application has been received by the Lord Lieutenant from thirty-one Householders, residing in the Parish of St. Mary's, Donnybrook, in the County of Dublin, adjoining to, but outside the boundary of the Borough of the City of Dublin, each occupying a Dwelling-house rated or assessed under the provisions of the aforesaid Act of 1st & 2nd Victoria, Cap. 56, as of the Annual Value of Twenty Pounds or more, by which Memorial it is prayed that His Excellency will be pleased to authorize the carrying this Act into execution, so far as the same relates to the supplying of pure water, within the District of Ringsend, Irishtown, and Sandymount, in the said Parish of St. Mary's, Donnybrook.

I am commanded by the Lord Lieutenant to signify His Excellency's orders and directions to you, that you will convene a Meeting for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the said District of Ringsend, Irishtown, and Sandymount, in the said Parish of St. Mary's, Donnybrook, and that you will preside thereat accordingly.
