THE Lord Lieutenant having received from Twenty-one Householders residing in Upper Baggot-street, Pembroke-road, and Pembroke-place, in the parish of St. Peter's, and County of the City of Dublin, adjoining to, but outside, the boundary of the Borough of the City of Dublin, each of such Householders occupying a dwelling-house rated in respect thereof to the relief of the poor at the annual value of £20 or upwards, an application that the provisions of the Act 8th and 9th Victoria, Chapter 193, so far as relates to a Supply of Water for domestic uses, and also a Supply of Water for the purpose of extinguishing fire, may be carried into operation in that locality:

I am directed by the Lord Lieutenant to convey to you His Excellency's order and direction that you will convene a Meeting for the purpose of considering the carrying of the said Act into execution in the before-mentioned locality, and that you will preside thereat.

A copy of the Act is forwarded for your guidance in carrying its provisions into effect.
